
# Mark's Letter

When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread... Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast."'

[John 21.9 & 12]

This particular edition of *The Vine* covers the entire period of Lent, which is the season of the Church lasting 40 weekdays, during which Christians prepare themselves for Holy Week, traditionally by regular fasting and acts of penitence, such as giving up certain luxuries. This year Lent runs from February 13<sup>th</sup> (Ash Wednesday) to March 28<sup>th</sup> (Maundy Thursday).

This Lent I invite you to get serious about your own relationship with Jesus Christ. I urge you to pick up your Bibles and read one of the four Gospel accounts of his life, ministry and saving work. I encourage you every day to ask God to point out to you how you might be a better Christian disciple. And I ask that you make worship a priority, prayer a habit, and Christian service a practical reality in your life.



We live in a society which tends to view "being a Christian", not as the ultimately-important whole-life-enhancing God-

relationship it is, but as nothing more than "going to Church", which is perceived to be just another thing you might do during your leisure time. Sadly, as natives of this secularized society, we Christians can all too easily find ourselves going with the flow. We can find ourselves describing our faith in terms of the activities we do in a church building, and overlook the fact that it is actually meant to be an all-embracing relationship with Jesus Christ.

I wonder if part of the problem here has to do with the image of Jesus we have. It seems to me that Jesus Christ can be described as "extraordinary" in two quite different senses:

In the usual sense of the word, Jesus is extraordinary because he is clearly no regular guy:

- He is God's only begotten Son;
- He heals the sick, and raises the dead;
- One minute he's walking on water, the next he's turning it into wine:
- He preaches with unparalleled wisdom and insight;
- He claims for himself such titles as the Bread of Life, the Good Shepherd, the Light of the World, and the Way, the Truth & the Life;
- And, to top it all, despite dying the most horrific death, he is still alive!

Anyone who reads one of the four New Testament accounts of his life and ministry is left in no doubt whatsoever that Jesus is no ordinary man. But this presents us with a real problem. How on earth can we, in our secularized society, ever hope to relate to this extraordinary Jesus?


Well, this is where it is vital to recognize that Jesus is not just extraordinary in the usual sense of the word. Indeed, the writers of the four New Testament accounts were at pains to record that Jesus is also *extra*-ordinary in the sense that he is as down-to-earth as anybody who has ever walked upon it:

- He has experienced life in a family with all its ups and downs;
- He knows what it is like to be hungry and thirsty;
- He loves a good party and the company of friends;
- He knows what it is like to do a hard day's work;
- He experiences the full range of human emotions;
- And, even in his resurrected body, he enjoys a cooked breakfast!

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we do not follow a Master who is "so heavenly minded that he is of no earthly use". On the contrary, we follow one who has lived this ordinary human life so well, so fully, so completely, that with him there really is no division between the spiritual and the material. With Jesus, earthly things become heavenly. With Jesus, in the midst of everyday life people receive eternal life. For those who decide to take seriously their relationship with Jesus, ordinary things become extraordinary.

As we prepare ourselves to ponder anew the events of Holy Week, may we also walk so closely with Jesus that we experience in every part of our lives the power of his extraordinary way of life.

#### **COMFORT ZONE**

Welcome to the first of our regular reports on the activities at Comfort Zone.

For those of you who don't know, Comfort Zone is a drop-in centre and kitchen for local homeless and needy; run entirely by volunteers and funded by local contributions, with help from Methodist Action. We use the kitchen and fover at North Shore Methodist Church, Dickson Road, Blackpool.

On Monday evenings we are open 7pm - 9pm and, manned by volunteers mainly from TMC, we serve a hot meal; usually based on a jacket potato with various toppings followed by a hot dog and whatever else we have in stock or have the funds to buy. On Tuesday mornings food parcels are available at Central Methodist Church and on Wednesday mornings, back at NSM, there is breakfast, access to clothes etc. and various support agencies as available.

With all your support we were able to serve a special meal for Christmas. I cannot cook a full roast dinner for 60 people with the limited resources at North Shore but we did make a top quality feast with loads of treats, which went down really well.

With many thanks to all of you who give food and clothing so generously. Items just appear (usually quite anonymously!) in the box in the foyer without any fuss. You do us proud!

Over the next year I will introduce you to some of the volunteers (many of them our own teenagers) and maybe some of our customers.

To work comfortably on Mondays we need 12 volunteers, six or seven in the kitchen and five to wait-on and generally support the customers. If we had more volunteers we could organise a rota, so why not come down one Monday evening and see how we work. Speak to Greg or myself and we will get you there. (I won't promise not to put a tea towel in your hand!)

Please keep your support coming in, every tin of beans, hot dogs, corned beef etc, is really appreciated.

On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> April there is an open evening at TMC where you can find out more about Comfort Zone.

To me comfort zone is a window of opportunity through which I see people whom I would never come into contact with ordinarily. It has opened my eyes to the problems in society which seem to be overlooked. I have met some very interesting, friendly people who I enjoy talking to and offering advice. This may sound strange that a 16 year old girl can give advice but they seem to listen to me and react to what I say. It is very upsetting to see girls my age in the comfort zone, sometimes even girls I have been at school with who have fallen on hard times or have taken with the wrong crowd. It is even more heart breaking to close the doors of the comfort zone behind a person who has nowhere to go, nothing to eat and practically nothing suitable to wear.

I feel privileged to be able to help these people and hope and pray that they may, one day, find comfort.

I have felt for a while now that Comfort Zone was a worthy cause to support and therefore decided to become a volunteer. With some trepidation, I went along to volunteer for the first time a couple of weeks before Christmas. The instant warmth which I was greeted with was overwhelming. The fellow volunteers who also dedicate their time and effort provide a constant source of conversation and a relaxed, comfortable atmosphere. By meeting and communicating with the people who we serve, I have learnt a great deal about the reality which some people face in life every day. These people are homeless or destitute, with many suffering from substance abuse problems. Yet these would be the very people who Jesus would serve in his ministry. He sought to care for the marginalised. I felt before I went that this was a worthy cause, but now I am fully aware how worthy the work that is undertaken here actually is. The true love of Jesus is evident here.
